
However, there was one condition; Ramesh had to invest it in the stock market.

Dr. Sharmila Banerjee is a senior Media Professional, Filmmaker, Producer and Chairperson of International Women's Leaders Forum and C.E.O. of Green Chillies Media. She is very passionate about writing and encourages her students to think outside the box and create their own stories.

What do you think today's generation lacks when it comes to creative writing?

I think this generation is very creative but the only advice I'd like to give is that when writing about certain emotions, certain concepts that impact life, one has to be more patient and think through and then write about it, as this generation is very fast paced, where as life is a journey from birth to death and to understand life better, it is important to read good books of writers from the older generation and different generations to understand society better and get the depth into yourself and then attempt to write, as if you have awareness and understanding of life and emotions, you will be a better writer.

How did you realize you wanted to do something in

this field? From the first year of my college life, I was a student of English literature and did English honors from Delhi University, When I read stories from authors and read about the different types of societies it was very beautiful and I always thought I would be in the field of creativity. I was initially a journalist, a writer then I was an editor and then I became a filmmaker. Once I was a filmmaker, I had an opportunity to write creative things. From the very beginning I had decided that I will be a part of the creative journey.

How would you describe your writing style? What books do you recommend?

I actually am finishing a book which is a part of my journalistic adventure and I have a few blogs and two books- one on the cooperate world as to how the media has changed over the years and the other, on a tribal, caste-based community, who are forced into prostitution. There are a lot of good books which one must read, one of my favourite books is 'The Fountainhead' by Ayn Rand and later the same author wrote, 'Atlas Shrugged' which is also a great book. I feel you all should read Byron, Shakespeare Sophocles, some good poets. Even 'Man and Superman' is a book you all should read. Reading pieces by philosophers like Freud, Blake, Comte will help you interpret life better.

Any tips for the aspiring writers when they experience

writers block. Writer's block is something when the mind cannot go beyond and think of something new and you get stuck within your own circumstances. A writer's block can be removed by reading more books, focusing on good content, understanding of certain genres in proper way and continuously trying to put your thoughts in a creative way, and every time a new thought, an idea comes up, just write it down, so that from there you can pick up something better.

What do you do to keep your story/writing fresh and original?

Each author is very different and has their own concept of writing, so you are different when you think differently, understand concepts differently and understand life in your own way, so you know, two authors will never write the same thing until you try and copy. So, the best thing is not to copy another author but to think in your mind ingenuously and then write. When you write you need to understand certain elements of writing- what is required in writing, who are the people you want to write about, who are your characters, how are your character placed, what is happening to your character; all these questions need to be answered before you start writing. If you are not copying you will stand out, people should not feel like they have already read it somewhere else. It is always better to be original and to write something that is your own thought.

What is the importance of theater and how is it different from films?



Theater has been exiting from the days of Shakespeare and before that a lot of Greek plays were written and enacted, then came ballads. Theater is an ancient form of performing arts and is very original and if a person is a part of theater and understands it you will realise that it involves depth as you are going to perform just once and in front of live audience so there is no concept of going wrong, whereas in a film if a shot/acting is not proper then it can be corrected but theater is a one time thing which involves acting, direction, lighting, backstage,music etc. therefore the is very less possibility of going wrong there. Once you are a good theater artist you understand film making much better

What makes a good filmmaker?

A good film maker has to have an understanding of everything that comprises of a film. So, a good film maker has to be a good actor, a director who can guide, a good writer, has to have a thorough understanding of music, he should know post production, know the camera angl what type of lighting and location the scene needs. Everything should be clear in the mind of a film maker, he should have the complete clarity and once there is clarity, the filmmaker will bring in all the necessary elements in the film and a good film will be made

ALL BOOKED - Book Review-"21 Lessons for the 21st Century " by Yuval Noah Harari

This book is divided into five parts: discussion on these issues, potential responses to them, an analysis of how humans can rise to the occasion to help solve these problems, a discussion of whether humans can truly understand global nature of these problems, and his solution for helping them gain clarity.

In this book, he intends to focus more on what is happening in the present (i.e., early twenty-first century) within a historical context by considering both past and future. He also says that this book will consider different technological developments as well as how individuals, governments, and socio-political movements make use of them. He adds that it places all considerations within a historical context by looking at liberal democracy which has proven to be best way to maintain healthy societies despite its flaws and failings.

This book gave mildly opinionated point of view a couple of times but the author also made it clear by mentioning it in the end that He could either self-censor and not say what he really thought or write the truth as he saw it.



PEACH (PERSONALITY COACH)

How quickly can personality traits be modified? Can an app help you modify your personality? An international research team has shown that daily use of an app can help develop your desired personality changes within 3 months.

Personality traits like conscientiousness or sociability, change throughout our lives with every experience you have. Interactions with individuals and adopting to environment results in individual changes, however is it possible to influence certain personality trait psychologically in a short term and in a targeted manner?

PEACH (Personality coACH) - a smartphone application was developed by the SWISS National science Foundation (SNSF) to study change in personality through digital intervention. The application provides communication capabilities using a digital agent that mimics a conversation with a human.

The PEACH app also includes reminders of individual goals, digital journaling, video clips, opportunities for self reflection and feedback on progress. Weekly core topics and small interventions aims to address and activates the desired changes leading to development of personality traits.

Even though the PEACH app is developed as a research tool, it is thought that research apps such as PEACH will be made widely available in the future.




Itch summit

Nitesh Tiwari's journey in Bollywood began in 2011 with 'Chillar Party' - a unique piece of work which changed the way people looked at films. "We just wrote the story, it was never our plan to direct it", he said, referring to him and his co-director. "But we were left with no option since nobody wanted to direct the film because it had ten children, one dog and no stars". His directorial debut won his film a National Film Award, and since then, he has gone on to direct and write notable films, such as Dangal, Bareilly Ki Barfi, and more. Today, he is a successful writer-director and none of this would have been possible without his passion for creating and delivering stories that are portrayed through characters inspired from his real-life experiences.

Entering the Hindi Film Industry wasn't an easy decision for him, it was one that required him to close his eyes, hope for the best and take a plunge. And it's safe to say that it did pay off. While he was pursuing his graduation in engineering from IIT Bombay in '96, he realized that he wanted to change his career path. He decided that he wanted to work in the creative field, which led him to joining the American advertising company, Leo Burnett. "I had to convince myself to leave my advertising job for a few months to direct a feature film without having any real experience, but I realized that there was nothing to lose", says Tiwari, glad that he trusted his gut.


His latest direction, Chhichhore, was a "self-realization exercise" for him. Tiwari drew heavily from his own life to shape the plot and characters of the film - he had started struggling with the idea of being a 'loser' in '91, when he failed his first attempt to clear IITJEE. While he passed the entrance exam in the following year, a lot of his friends didn't, despite numerous attempts. He disclosed that dealing with that failure is hard and that the episode scarred his friends, because nobody told them that eventually, things will fall into place. Chhichhore went on to win the National Film Award for Best Feature Film in Hindi in 2020, and this was possible only because of Tiwari's constant itch to tell heart-touching stories and showcase human emotions through films.
